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CAPIC/MHSA Online Training Modules Instruction and Overview:

In September 2008, CAPIC was awarded a contract for over \$2.6 million from the California Department of Mental Health (CA/DMH) funded through the Mental Health Service Act (MHSA aka Prop 63). CAPIC was awarded this contract to provide stipends to psychology students doing internships in publicly supported mental health agencies in California, and to develop educational materials that would help train psychologists in the Resiliency-Recovery theoretic approach to treating people with chronic mental health problems.

As part of this CAPIC/MHSA stipend program, CAPIC created online training modules. Each module was developed as a stand-alone learning experience, and, beyond their use as training/educational resources, each module is also approved for 2.0 hours of Continuing Education (CE) credits for California-licensed Mental Health clinicians.

These CE credits are administered by Alliant International University. These CAPIC/MHSA online training modules are available through the [CAPIC website](http://www.capic.net). Each module is made up of 8 parts: (1) Module Introduction; (2) Goals and Learning Objectives; (3) Reading List; (4) Video Introduction (5 minutes); (5) Video Lecture (approx. 50 minutes); (6) PowerPoint Presentation of Lecture Materials; (7) Study Questions and Online Discussion Board; and (8) Course Evaluation and Multiple-Choice Examination.

There is a \$15 fee for processing these CE credits, which are being administered by Alliant International University. If you are not seeking CE credits, there is no CE administration fee and no cost for using these online modules.

Participants seeking CE credits must complete all aspects of a module including passing a multiple-choice exam. At the start of the exam, participants are asked for their California license number (if seeking CE credits), as well as basic contact information, in order to properly process the CE credits. Once a participant has successfully completed all aspects of the module, s/he will be contacted regarding CE credits, including payment of the \$15 administrative fee and issuance of the CE completion certificate. Regardless of whether you are seeking CE credits, we hope the knowledge gained will serve you in your professional endeavors and in the care you provide your clients.

- Select the top right tab called “Training Modules” to access this section.
 - Review the video introduction to these online training modules.

 - These first two steps (Video Intro and Overview) need only be reviewed once for understanding how all of these modules are set up.
- Click on the List of Modules tab to access links to each of the training modules.
 - Click on the link for the particular online module you wish to view.
 - Then click through the tabs to review the various aspects of the online module (from Introduction to Examination), as described below.

Online Training Modules

In order to make maximum use of each learning module, it is recommended that each module be reviewed in the order presented:

1. Read the Introduction to the Topic.
2. Read the Goals & Learning Objectives.
3. Read the articles on the Reading List. Some presenters also provide additional reading, labeled "Reference List," if you are particularly interested in learning more about the topic you will find these references very useful in your self-learning process.
4. Many materials on the recommended reading list are available through online subscription services. CAPIC does not have subscription access to these online journals, but many doctoral academic programs do.
5. Watch the video titled "Introduction to the Speaker."
6. Watch the video of the Lecture Video.
7. Review lecture content by viewing the Slide Show slide presentation.
8. Review the Study Questions, post your own responses on the online Discussion Board/BBS, and see posted responses from others. NOTES:
 - Responses to study questions are posted on a group discussion board for review by all participants who have completed that specific module. Also, to register on the BBS, you will need to enter the following registration code: "C@PIC34". This is done to avoid spam.
9. When you feel prepared, take the Exam at the end of the module. While you take the exam you are free to use any material from the module itself, any notes you have made, or any other resources you have on this topic. Remember, the examination may cover material from all areas of the module, not just the lecture and the readings.

In order to successfully complete a module, you must score at least 75% correct on the examination. The examination is scored immediately upon completion and shared with the stipend recipient. Should you not achieve a passing score you must retake the examination, but there will be a different set of questions on the second, and any subsequent tests. CAPIC is also informed of all passing scores.
