

**American School of Professional Psychology at Argosy University, San Francisco Bay Area**  
**2017-2018 Post-Doctoral Fellow**

The Argosy Assessment & Intervention Clinic (AAIC) full-time Post-Doctoral Fellowship position is a yearlong university based position that begins the August 14, 2017 and lasts 52 weeks (ends August 10<sup>th</sup>, 2018). This fellowship provides the unique opportunity to gain experience in managing an outpatient mental health clinic. In addition to the administrative tasks associated with management, fellows will gain experience with conducting comprehensive psychoeducational and psychodiagnostic assessments (all ages) within a Collaborative/Therapeutic Assessment model, providing therapy (all ages), and will be mentored through providing consultation and supervision to practicum students. The position also involves providing didactic training, management of ongoing AAIC research projects, site visits, and community outreach. Fellows receive 2.5 hours of individual supervision and 1.5 hours of group supervision weekly, 1 hour of didactic training on university training issues weekly, and 1.5 - 3 hours of clinical didactic training on a monthly basis including an intensive R-PAS training. Fellows receive a stipend of \$24,000 plus benefits for the year, paid time off from 12/18/17-1/1/18, and 8 additional holidays. Additionally, fellows may take up to 5 further days of paid leave, although this may impact their ability to accrue 2000 hours of SPE.
